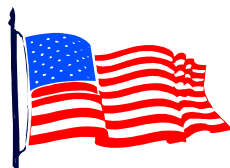
Duck Race

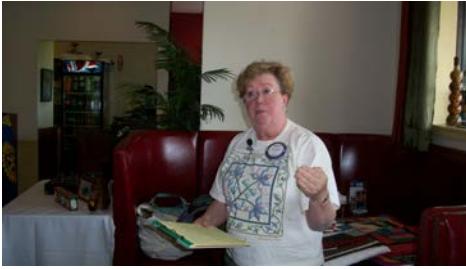

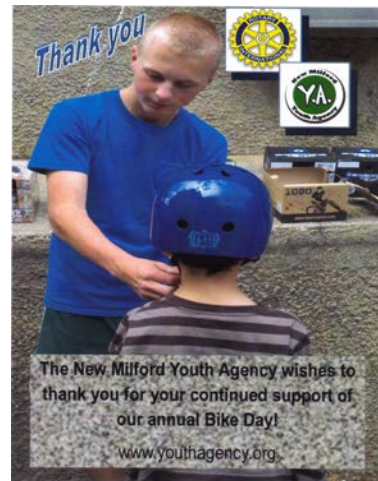
